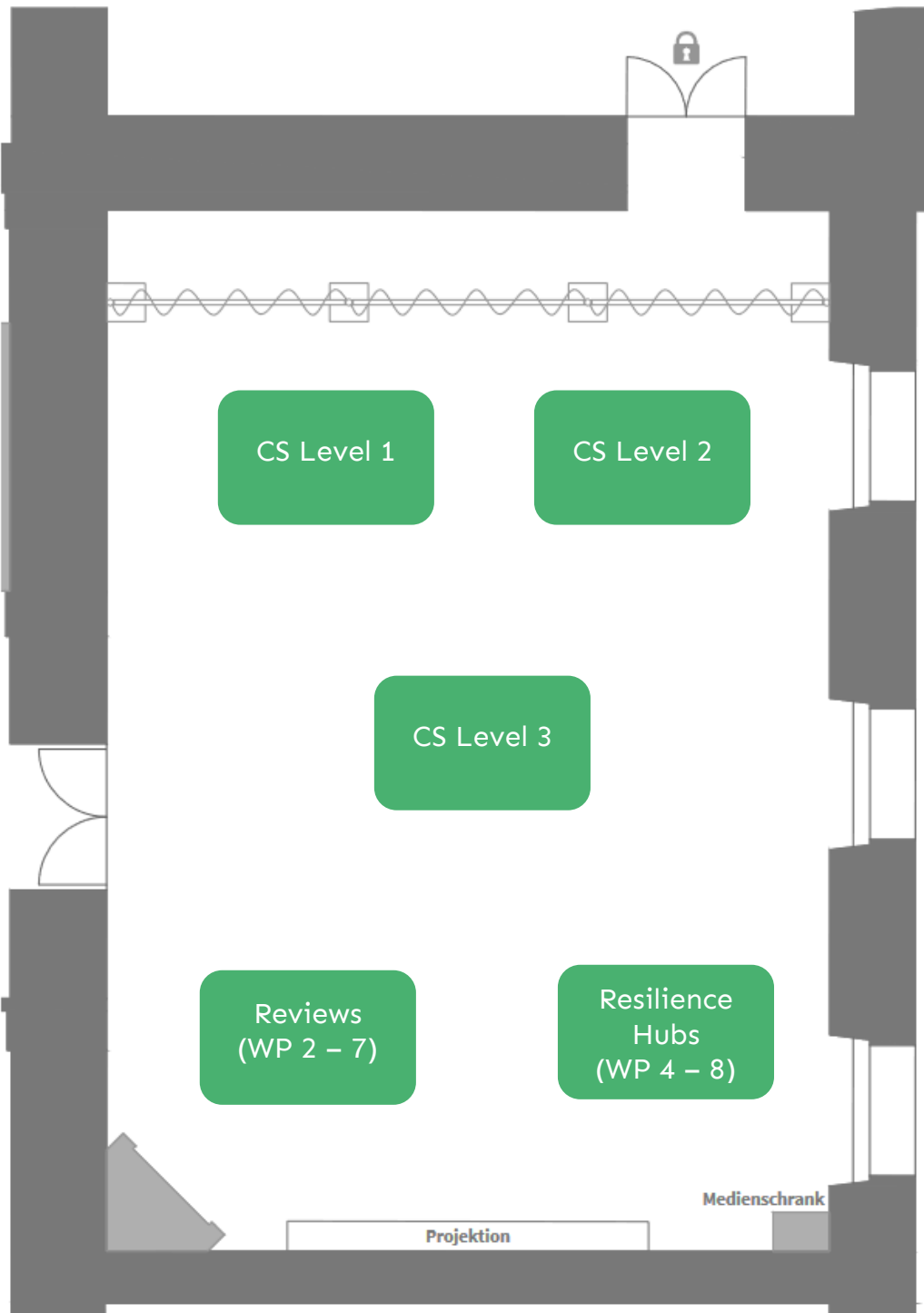

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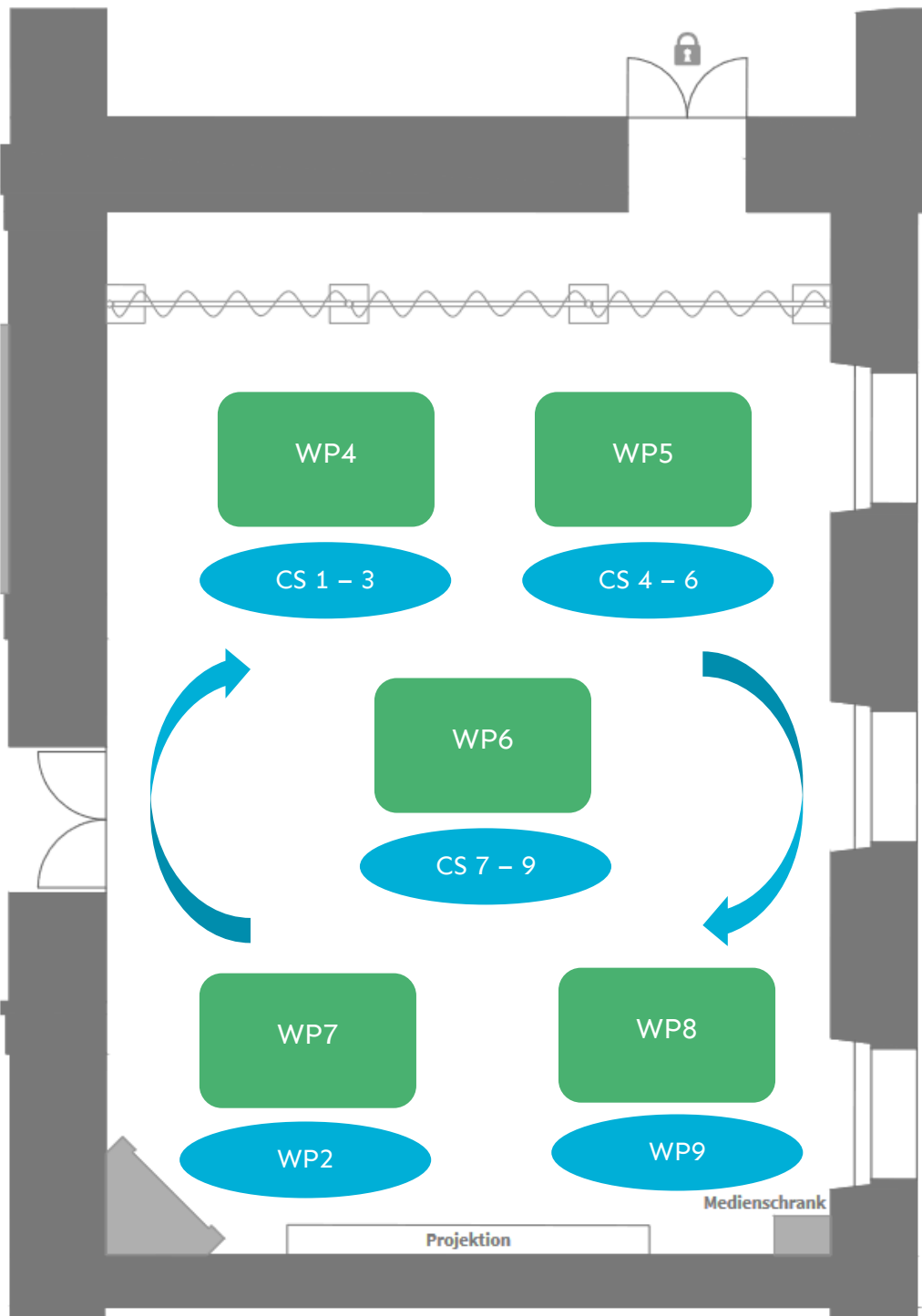

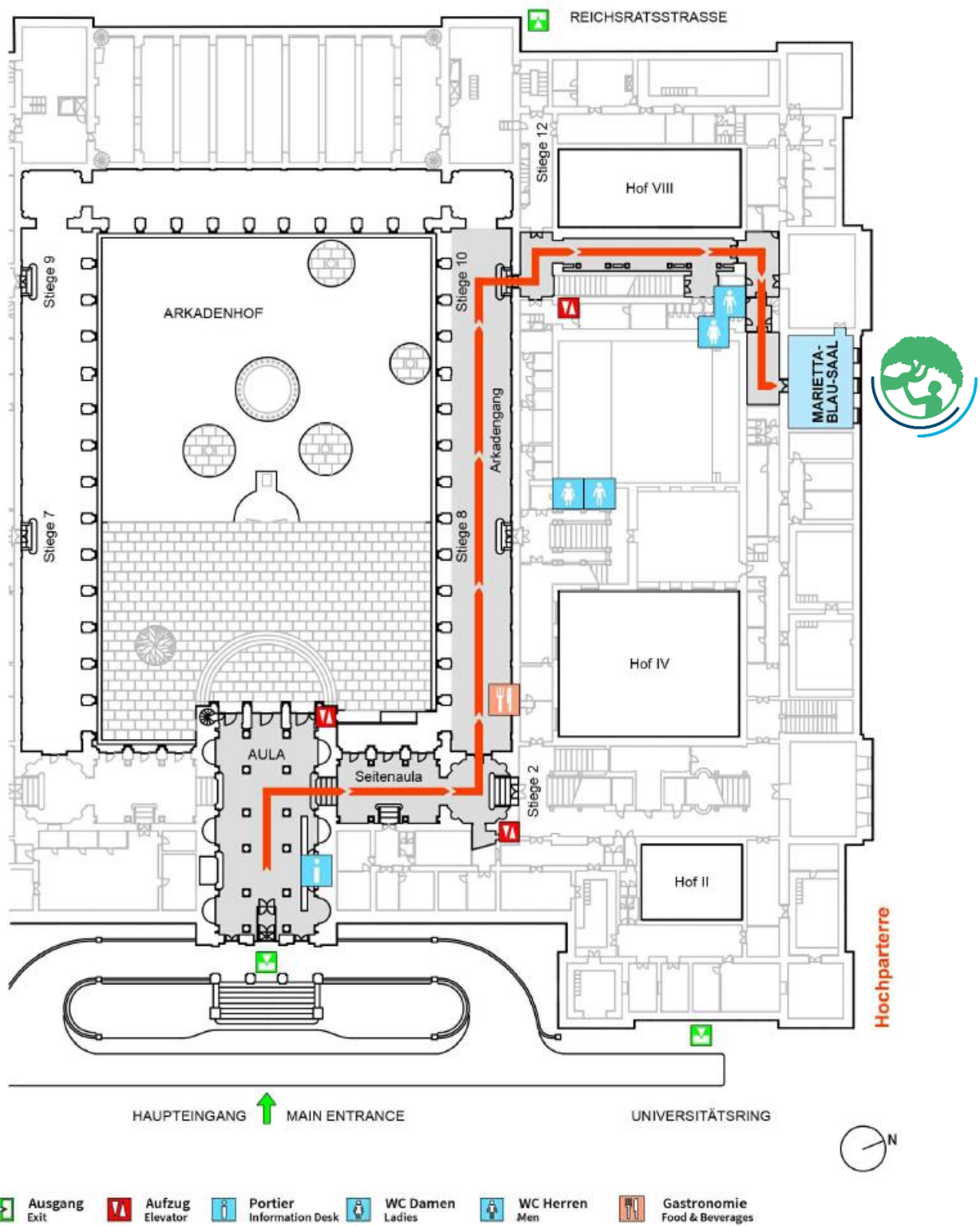


World Café Session 2 – Seating

PREPARATORY INFORMATION

WP/CS presentations

On Thursday, each WP and CS will get the opportunity to give a short presentation (5 min/3 slides) to introduce their team, objectives, and timelines. (Except for WP9, they will have 20 min to present the website and project communication). This way we want to establish an overview of the current state for each WP & CS, in order to get everyone on the same page before we head into detailed discussions.

We would kindly ask you to send us your slides by **Wednesday, 13th September 16:00**, so that we can add all slides into one presentation and avoid losing time when changing between presenters. You can send the slides to Julia directly via e-mail or upload them in the shared OneDrive folder.

World Café Sessions

For the launch meeting, we wanted to try something different, using the World Café conversation method. In these sessions, you will have the opportunity to sit together in different groups and discuss relevant topics. Of course, there might not be enough time to go in-depth, but this way we want to make sure that everyone gets to talk with each other.

Members of the IEAB are invited to walk around and join the discussions.

World Café Session 1

In this session, the five tables will consist of the following groups:

- CS Level 1 (CS1, CS2, & CS3)
- CS Level 2 (CS4, CS5, & CS6)
- CS Level 3 (CS7, CS8, & CS9)
- Reviews (WP2, WP4, WP5, WP6, WP7)
- Resilience Hubs (WP4, WP5, WP6, WP7, WP8)

The main objective in this session is to discuss the key features of the different Case Studies, Reviews and Work Package tasks and to align next steps & overlapping elements. In order to prepare for this session, we suggest the following discussion points:

- What progress have you made with the study/WP objectives?
- What are still open questions?
- What data is needed from the Case Studies / Work Packages?
- Where do your Case Studies or Work Package objectives align?
- How could the further progress be optimised?

At the end, we invite each table to provide a 5-minute summary on the key decisions or open questions for each of them.

World Café Session 2

In this session, the following Work Packages will have a table:

- WP4
- WP5
- WP6
- WP7
- WP8

The Case Studies and remaining Work Packages will be combined in groups as follows:

- CS1, CS2, & CS3
- CS4, CS5, & CS6
- CS7, CS8, & CS9
- WP2
- WP9

Each group will have 25 minutes with a WP table and then switch to another one, until they have visited all five. The main objective for this session is for the Work Packages and Case Studies to discuss, what is needed and how they can support each other in the upcoming period.

- What information does the WP need to be collected by the CS?
- What information does the CS need from the WP for the Ethics application?
- How can the work of both WPs & CSs be supported by the other?

Early Career Network

At the end of Thursday, Lewis (WP8) and Julia would like to have a short session with the early career researchers of RESONATE, to set-up a network within the project. Anyone who self-identifies as an early career researcher is welcome to join. More information will be given at the launch meeting.

Plenary Meeting Next Steps

Towards the end of the launch meeting, we would like everyone to provide an overview of the plans in upcoming six-month-period. There is 40 minutes in the morning set aside (*Get-together for each WP/CS*) so that each WP/CS can prepare the overview with a max of 5 min/3 slides per WP/CS. Of course, you can prepare part of this in advance and fill in new relevant information after the first day of the launch meeting.

Contact Information

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Luggage

Generally, check-in at most hotels can only be done after 15:00, however, you can leave your heavy luggage in a luggage room at the reception. You can also use the luggage room after you checked-out, to collect it at a later point. If you wish, we can also arrange to put luggage in Julia's and Rebecca's office (2.41) at the Vienna Cognitive Science Hub (Kolingasse 14-16, 1090 Vienna) on Friday after the official meeting has concluded.

Meals and refreshments

Wednesday

For Wednesday night, we invite you to join an informal dinner at the Luftburg Kolarik in the Prater (<https://kolarik.at/en/luftburg/>) from 18:00 onwards. The restaurant serves traditional Austrian cuisine and is located between the amusement park ("Würschtelprater") and the green areas ("Grüner Prater") of the Prater, about 20 minutes away from the university using the metro line U2 (metro station: *Praterstern* or *Messe/Prater*). Julia will be in front of the main building of the University at 17:15-17:30 in case anyone would like to go together with her. The costs of this dinner including drinks will need to be paid by everyone separately, it is not covered by the RESONATE budget of the launch meeting.

Thursday

Throughout the day, you will be able to get coffee, tea, water, and apple & orange juice through the catering in front of the Marietta-Blau-Saal. In the

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first coffee break (10:00 – 10:30) you will also be able to get fruit and a snack, and there will be a buffet during the lunch break (12:30 – 13:30).

In the evening, we will meet at restaurant Wrenkh (Bauernmarkt 10, 1010 Vienna), where we will have a family style (=sharing various dishes) three-course dinner. Water and two non-alcoholic drinks are also covered in the menu paid via the RESONATE launch meeting budget, alcoholic or additional drinks will need to be paid separately.

Friday

Same as on Thursday, you will be able to get coffee, tea, water, and juices from the catering, as well as fruit and a snack in the first coffee break (11:10 – 11:25).

For lunch, we can recommend cafés, restaurants and small shops in the area, though this is not covered by the RESONATE launch meeting budget.

Meetings (outside of the official agenda)

As some of you will be arriving before the launch meeting or staying longer after the official meeting has concluded, this might provide opportunities to meet up with other partners of the consortium to discuss any subjects in detail. There are several cafés close to the University of Vienna, which would be suitable for these meetings (Café Diglas im Schottenstift, for example; <https://cafeimschottenstift.at/>). Additionally, we reserved two meeting rooms at the Vienna Cognitive Science Hub (Kolingasse 14-16, 1090 Vienna), please let us know if you would like to use them.

Public Transport in Vienna

Vienna has a tight and well-organised public transport network, including metro lines, trams, busses & rapid transit railway.

Public transport tickets (for 1, 2 or 3 days – not refundable, meaning when bought you cannot return them even if you did not use the ticket. The tickets can be reimbursed with the travel funding of your organisation) with a 10 percent discount rate for participants of the Launch Meeting can be booked here:

You may use all public transport (including night busses and trains) within the Vienna metropolitan area with all tickets of Wiener Linien.

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The metro (U-Bahn) runs from about 5:00 a.m. to about mid-night (trams and buses normally stop running earlier). Vienna's metro lines operate 24 hours a day on Friday night, Saturday night and on the nights before holidays. The trains run at 15-minute intervals.

Night buses operate daily from 12:30 a.m. to 5 a.m. in 30-minute cycles. Please check the website of the [Vienna Transport Authority](#) for the schedules of the Nightline.

Should you wish to purchase public transport tickets to/from the airport (at regular rate), you can do so following this link:

You can also take a train or rapid transit railway from the airport to the city centre, which is cheaper than the options above (about 4,4€). The REX7 & S7 leave for the city every half hour and take about 20 minutes. Tickets can be booked here: <https://shop.oebbtickets.at/en/ticket>

Supermarkets

Supermarket weekday opening hours are from around just before 8am to 8pm. Other stores generally open later and close earlier. Small food stores at bus/train/gas stations may be open longer and on Sundays, just like some bakeries.

Tap Water

Vienna's tap water is not only potable but of highest quality. You can consume it directly from the faucet in your accommodation or at the university, and there are around 1.300 drinking fountains spread all over the city.

Wi-Fi at the University

The University of Vienna uses eduroam, which means that if you have access to eduroam via your university or institution, you will have immediate internet access. There is also a possibility to gain internet access via a Wi-Fi voucher, if you have no eduroam connection. In this case, please contact Julia or Rebecca, we will be able to provide you with a temporary Wi-Fi voucher.
